## SYMPTOM CRITERIA FOR A DIAGNOSIS OF ADHESIVE ARACHNOIDITIS (AA)

Our research studies have shown that the spinal canal inflammatory diseases (SCID) arachnoiditis (ARC), and adhesive arachnoiditis (AA) are a major underlying cause for the development of IPS.

Our Arachnoiditis Research and Education Project studies have revealed a specific symptom pattern common among several hundred persons who have MRI-confirmed, lumbar-sacral AA.

Over 80% have these five symptoms:

- 1. Constant back pain with stabbing or shooting pains into the buttocks, legs, or feet.
- 2. Pain is lessened by standing or reclining.
- 3. Difficulty starting, stopping, or holding urination.
- 4. Burning or electrical shocks in feet.
- 5. Sensation of insects or water on the legs.

If a person has 3 or more of the symptoms shown here, a contrast lumbar-sacral MRI and blood tests for spinal canal inflammation are warranted.
